









Year 1 Number Check for families: Guide

Here is an example of the type of questions the teacher will ask your child in the Year 1 Number Check at school.

Listen and watch your child as they answer the questions. Write on this guide any comments or questions you have as your child answers the questions. You may also like to talk about their answers with your child's teacher.

Question	Look for an answer like this	Hints to help your child or look for ways they answered
	It's 5.	You could ask: 'Where have you seen that number?'
	That is 11.	Did your child know it was 11 or did they say 'one, one'?
	There are 6 dots.	Did your child count the dots one by one or could they see it was 6 without counting?
	The next number is 16.	Did your child say the number straight away, or did they start from one, or 10, or say 15 and then count the next number?
	The number before 20 is 19.	Did your child say the number straight away, or did they start from 20 and backwards by one?
	22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31	Did your child get all the numbers in the correct order? Write the numbers as they say them. You can then go back over the numbers with your child if there were any errors.
	17, 16, 15, 14, 13, 12, 11, 10, 9, 8	Did your child get all the numbers in the correct order? Write the numbers as they say them. You can then go back over the numbers with them if there were any errors.
	There are 8 animals altogether.	Did your child count the animals one by one, group them by 5 + 3, or start at 5 and count on by ones to 8?
